# SCALING-UP BUSINESS SOLUTIONS TO SUSTAINABILITY CHALLENGES









## A. GENERAL INTRODUCTION

#### I. Rationale

In late September 2015, Vietnam together with 192 member states of the United Nations adopted 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as the central focus of the global development agenda for the next fifteen years (the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development). Since then, the government of Vietnam has been developed a practicable action plan for the forceful implementation of this Agenda, notably including the localization of SDGs, which can be dubbed as V-SDGs. Of course, government's efforts alone would never be enough to realize these highly ambitious development goals. Efforts are imperative at all levels, across all sectors and by all stakeholders, of which the private sector has a critical role to play. Business leaders can translate the SDGs' ambitions and words into action underpinned by business solutions: business-led ventures that are impactful, scalable, measurable, replicable, and going beyond business as usual.<sup>1</sup>

#### II. Objective

The 4<sup>th</sup> Vietnam Corporate Sustainability Forum (VCSF 2017) will build upon the success of the past three VCSFs which were convened in 2014, 2015 and 2016. Under the theme of *"Scaling-up business solutions to sustainability challenges"*, this year's Forum will gather government, business and civil society leaders and representatives together to discuss ways to create an enabling environment for the thriving of innovative business solutions that are not only commercially viable but also effectively address environmental and social issues. VCSF 2017 aims to be an interactive platform for participants to update and exchange sustainable business practices, models and ideas, thus exploring untapped investment opportunities. The Forum also facilitate the dialogue to enhance governmental supports for business sustainable development.

Objectives of VCSF 2017 are as follows:

- To explain why and how SDGs and businesses matter to each other
- To facilitate the update and sharing of the latest information, knowledge, experience as well as good practices and models on sustainable development among companies and relevant stakeholders
- To provide updates regarding plans, programmes and initiatives of the government of Vietnam and international organizations that engage and support Vietnam's private sector in the realization of SDGs
- To promote and strengthen the Business-Government-Civil Society partnership for the successful implementation of SDGs in Vietnam
- To raise public awareness on sustainable development issues through the mass media
