Building transparent and traceable soy supply chains, June 2020

Soy sourcing and traceability data

Louis Dreyfus Company's (LDC) dedicated Soy Sustainability Policy signals our intent to influence our supply chain, going beyond applicable laws and regulations to incentivize stakeholders to conserve native vegetation in ecologically valuable biomes.

A long-term preferential financing line was created and rolled out in 2019, with more uptake expected through 2020 and beyond.

LDC is also actively working on traceability-to-farm, monitoring and transparency across its supply chain, [with progress updated on its website.](#)

LDC has a minority stake (33%) in ALZ Grãos, a company operating in Matopiba region. LDC is working with its partners to support the implementation of ALZ's sustainability policy (in Portuguese), successfully launched in 2020, and of related processes.

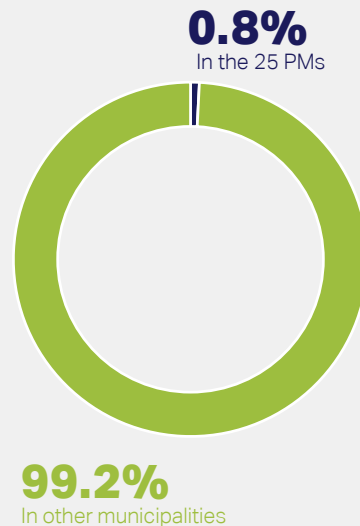

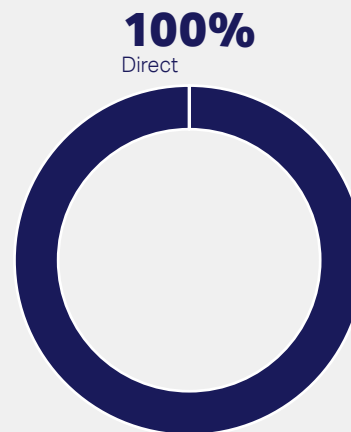
Soy volume sourced in Brazil (data from 2019)



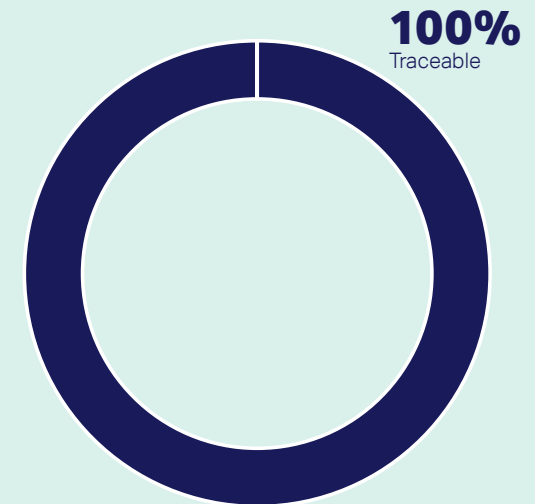
Soy volume sourced in Cerrado (data from 2019)
